Bill and I were lucky enough to fly south in Mid-February to attend USPS National Conference in Florida. I arrived with an earache and Bill spent the second day in bed with Kidney stone pain. My ear improved and he passed multiple stones. The meeting was lightly attended but there was good news that we are gaining new members but sadly we are losing as many as we gain. 
for the Predicted Log, Learn the Nautical Alphabet even open up some of our past editions (GPPS-D9. com).




