





Happy days to you! As I write this article, summer is officially gone and the boating season is drawing to an end for Michigan boaters. I hope you had a good boating season and managed to get out on the boat and visit some interesting places.

As commander, I attended the United States Power Squadrons National Governing Board meeting held in Louisville, Kentucky, September 8-15, 2019. It was the last of the separate national governing board meetings going forward. Others from our squadron also attended and everyone had their focus and interests. There are changes to the lifejackets and the sizing scheme. There are new reflective safety stickers to go on the oars for the paddle boats. Most importantly for our membership, the national organization has signed an MOA with DAN Boaters, a diving organization and now our members have travel insurance that is in effect when they travel more than fifty miles from home. This insurance becomes effective for you mid- October, is free until your annual renewal. At or before renewal, you can opt out or pay \$25 per year to keep these benefits. The new insurance will cover the following benefits:

- 24/7 Emergency Hotline
- Medical Information Line for non-emergency travel health questions
- Worldwide Medical Evacuation Assistance (up to \$150,000)
- Worldwide Medical Repatriation Assistance (up to \$25,000)
- Search and Rescue Expense Reimbursement (up to \$25,000)
- Free Travel Health and Safety Guides
- Travel Assistance Services including prescription assistance, medical and legal referrals, the emergency return of traveling companion or dependent children, and more

As we move through the events planned for this year, please plan on attending the D9 Fall Conference scheduled for Nov 1-2 at the Dearborn Detroit Doubletree, 5801 Southfield Freeway, in Detroit, MI. The theme for the hospitality rooms is sports and GPPS has chosen bowling. As always Ron and Bonnie Utz and their committee are planning a wonderful time for all. If you can't stay or return for the Saturday council meeting, come on down on Friday to have fun with us!


## Administrative Department Lt/C Rose Stano, AP




#### Ahoy,

The Highway Mariners was formed by members of the United States Power Squadrons, who prefer to travel to USPS National Meetings by Recreational Vehicles. It is an informal group. The Wagon Master attempts to locate a camping facility near the headquarters hotel for the group to camp together and share fellowship similar to that enjoyed by USPS members at a cruise and rendezvous. Many members of the Highway Mariners who travel to the meeting site by RV stay in the headquarters hotel, but enjoy traveling via recreational vehicle to and from the meeting location. The group was formed in 1993 and the first formal meeting was at the Annual Meeting at the Lowes Anatola Hotel in Dallas, TX. Floyd Quisenberry and Dan Katz served as Wagon Master and Editor of the newsletter for many years and were especially instrumental in keeping all interested members informed. All members of USPS are eligible for membership in the Highway Mariners. The dues are \$8.50 per year or 3 years for \$25.00 to cover mailing and other expenses.


