NATALIE'S GUMBO RECIPE (Everyone loved the Gumbo at D9 Conference)

INGREDIENTS

- 12 pieces/Chicken (Big - Chicken thigh's)
- 1 cup all-purpose flour
- 3/4 cup bacon drippings
- 1 cup coarsely chopped celery
- 1 large onion, coarsely chopped (approx. 2 cups or more to taste)
- 1 large green bell pepper, coarsely chopped (approx. 1 cup or more to taste)
- 2 cloves garlic, minced
- 1 pound andouille sausage, sliced
- 3 quarts water
- 6 cubes beef bouillon (you can substitute beef broth for cubes and water)
- 1 tablespoon white sugar
- salt to taste
- 2 tablespoons hot pepper sauce (such as Tabasco®), or to taste
- 1/2 teaspoon Cajun seasoning blend (such as Tony Chachere's®), or to taste
- 1tsp. Cayenne (or to taste)
- 4 bay leaves
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme leaves
- 1 (14.5 ounce) can stewed tomatoes
- 1 (6 ounce) can tomato sauce
- 2 teaspoons gumbo file powder
- 2 tablespoons bacon drippings
- 2 (10 ounce) packages frozen cut okra, thawed (or 1lb fresh okra, thinly sliced)
- 2 tablespoons distilled white vinegar
- 1 1/2 tsp. Basil
- 2 pounds uncooked medium shrimp peeled and deveined
- 2 teaspoons gumbo file powder (optional)
- hot cooked rice

DIRECTIONS

1. Bring the water and beef bouillon cubes to a boil in a large Dutch oven or soup pot. Stir until the bouillon cubes dissolve. Cook chicken thigh's in beef broth for one hour. (Remove/ meat let cool) &Cube/chicken thigh's
2. Make a roux by whisking the flour and 3/4 cup bacon drippings together in a large, heavy saucepan over medium-low heat to form a smooth mixture. Vegetable oil can be substituted for all or part of the bacon drippings, but it will affect the flavor. Cook the roux, whisking constantly, until it turns a rich mahogany brown color. This can take 20 to 30 minutes; watch heat carefully and whisk constantly or roux will burn. Remove from heat; continue whisking until mixture stops cooking.
3. Chop the celery, onion, green bell pepper, and garlic. Stir the vegetables into the roux, and mix in the sausage. Let vegetables caramelize. Bring the mixture to a simmer over medium-low heat, and cook until vegetables are tender, 10 to 15 minutes. Remove from heat, and set aside.
4. Whisk the roux mixture into the beef bouillon. Reduce heat to a simmer, and mix in the sugar, salt, cayenne, hot pepper sauce, Cajun seasoning, bay leaves, thyme, basil, stewed tomatoes, and tomato sauce. Simmer the soup over low heat for 1 hour; mix in 2 teaspoons of file gumbo powder at the 45-minute mark. Skim excess fat and foam off the top.
5. Meanwhile, roughly chop 3 strips of bacon and cook until browned in a skillet. Add and cook the okra with vinegar over medium heat for 15 minutes; remove okra with slotted spoon, and stir into the simmering gumbo. Mix in shrimp and Worcestershire sauce, and simmer. After 15 minutes, add chicken and simmer until flavors have blended, 30 more minutes. Just before serving over hot cooked rice, stir in 2 more teaspoons of file gumbo powder if desired.

The assumed name does not change the name of the corporation, it allows the corporation to operate under the new name in public if it so chooses.

John Bennett and Jon Eadie will work on incorporating our new name – America's Boating Club Grosse Pointe. Thank you both for working on this project.

ENGINE ROOM

ENGINE(S)

- ☐ Fill fuel tanks and add stabilizer to gasoline
- ☐ Change oil and filter
- ☐ Change fuel filters/separators in engine(s)
- ☐ Check coolant level in freshwater-cooling system and add coolant if necessary
- ☐ Run antifreeze through raw-water-cooling system
- ☐ Make sure water strainers are filled with antifreeze
- ☐ Fog cylinders in gasoline engines
- ☐ Top up battery electrolyte level and put batteries on marine charger

INSTALLED GENERATOR

- ☐ Change oil and filter
- ☐ Change fuel filters/separators
- ☐ Check coolant level in freshwater-cooling system and add coolant if necessary
- ☐ Run antifreeze through raw-water-cooling system
- ☐ Make sure water strainers are filled with antifreeze

OTHER SYSTEMS

- ☐ Flush and fill air conditioning system with antifreeze
- ☐ Run antifreeze through watermaker and pickle as per owner's manual

OUTBOARDS

- ☐ Fill installed fuel tanks and add stabilizer
- ☐ Turn off fuel supply and fog while running
- ☐ Drain gear case and add fresh lubricant
- ☐ Flush engine with muffs and fresh water
- ☐ Store unit in lowest position
- ☐ Inspect/replace anodes
- ☐ Empty fuel from portable tanks into car tank and take them home for storage



WINTERIZING CHECKLIST

OUTDRIVES

- ☐ If water intake is in lower unit, flush and run antifreeze through using muffs
- ☐ Drain gear oil and add fresh lubricant
- ☐ Inspect/replace anodes

BELOWDECKS

- ☐ Pump out holding tank and add antifreeze to head
- ☐ Drain water heater and bypass it
- ☐ Drain freshwater system and run antifreeze through it
- ☐ Run antifreeze through refrigeration, deck washdown pump, etc., per owner's manual
- ☐ Drain shower sump and other places where water pools
- ☐ Remove food
- ☐ Open lockers to air
- ☐ Take home cushions or store on their sides
- ☐ Take home portable electronics
- ☐ Close propane valves and take home portable canisters
- ☐ Verify bilge pump and switch operate properly
- ☐ Clean and dry bilges
- ☐ Secure all ports and hatches
- ☐ Turn off all circuit breakers

IN THE WATER

- ☐ Close all seacocks except for cockpit drains
- ☐ Plug exhaust ports
- ☐ Check docklines and chafe guards – center boat in slip
- ☐ Add or adjust fenders for proper placement

BEFORE YOU GO

- ☐ Tie off tiller/steering wheel
- ☐ Cover/shrinkwrap boat
- ☐ Lock cabin and leave spare key with marina manager

BOATERS!

INJURED While BOATING?

The boat owner or operator is required to report the accident.

The operator or owner of any recreational boat is required to file a Boating Accident Report if the boat is involved in an incident that results in:

1. Person's death or disappearance; or
2. Injury which requires medical treatment beyond first aid; or
3. Damage to the boat and other property exceeding _____; or
4. Complete loss of the boat.

Boat operators are required to report their accident to local authorities in the state where the accident occurred. To obtain a Boating Accident Report form, contact:

3 easy ways to renew!

Tips for renewing

- **Renew online:** Renew your watercraft registration at **www.ExpressSOS.com**. Make sure you are on the official Secretary of State website. Look for "**www.Michigan.gov**" or "**state.mi.us**" in the Web address. *Online Renewal PLUS* allows you to complete other transactions, such as a change of address, at the same time you renew. With *Express Renewal*, all you need is the watercraft MC number. Pay with a valid Discover, MasterCard or Visa debit or credit card. A nominal processing fee will be charged.
- **A change of address** may be submitted online, by mail or at a Secretary of State office when renewing.
- If the owner name or watercraft information is incorrect on your renewal notice, please renew at a Secretary of State office.
- When renewing online or by mail, your new watercraft decals and registration will be mailed within 14 business days.

The online, no-wait Secretary of State

Choose either *Online Renewal PLUS* or *Express Renewal* after selecting "Renew Watercraft." *Online Renewal PLUS* allows you to print a copy of your renewed watercraft registration. Your new watercraft decals and registration will be mailed within 14 business days.

Mail

Mail your renewal notice and payment using the enclosed envelope. Payment can be made by check or money order to the **State of Michigan**. Use the renewal worksheet for a debit and credit card payment with Discover, MasterCard or Visa. If your address is incorrect, draw a line through the incorrect information and clearly print your new address, including your county.

Secretary of State office

You can renew at any Secretary of State office. All offices accept cash, checks, money orders and Discover, MasterCard and Visa debit or credit cards. A nominal processing fee is charged when using a credit or debit card at the service counter. See the back of this brochure for hours and location information.

Note to boaters:

If your travels take you to Canada, Mexico, Bermuda or the Caribbean, consider getting an enhanced driver's license or state ID card. These federally accepted documents are issued at all Secretary of State offices and satisfy the identity and citizenship requirements when re-entering the U.S. by land or sea. 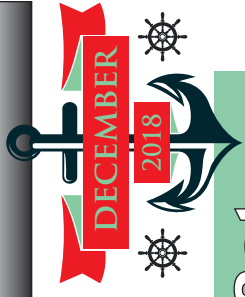

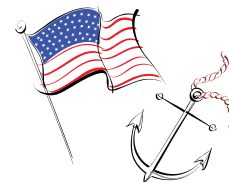
