

The cards serve as a segue for promoting America's Boating Club. Our Vessel Examiners will receive their business cards before the end of January.



Shift your plans for the coming year into high gear and commit to exploring Michigan's great outdoors throughout 2018. In the coming weeks, there are a number of <u>snow-worthy events</u> taking place in state parks, such as lantern-lit walks and guided snowshoe hikes, or other activities that can be navigated on your own time.

Winter camping brings cool adventure

Yes, you can camp during the winter months! Quieter surroundings, longer evenings at the campfire and stunning views are just a few of the benefits of winter camping.

A handful of Michigan state parks are open for winter camping, and a number of state parks offer unique alternative lodging options (camper cabins, yurts, cottages, pop-ups and lodges).

To view parks with winter camping, visit <u>michigan.gov/recsearch</u> and type "winter camping," "cabins & lodges," "mini cabins" or "yurt" in the search menu.

Free Fishing Weekend hooks anglers Feb. 17-18

Reel in the first of two <u>Free Fishing Weekends</u> Feb. 17-18. Twice a year, residents and non-residents can enjoy two back-to-back days of fishing without a license. All other fishing regulations apply.

Additionally, the DNR will waive the regular Recreation Passport entry fee that grants vehicle access to state parks. <u>Check out the official events scheduled for the weekend</u>.

Luge yourself: ice skating, skiing, sledding and much more

The ultimate winter adventure awaits you! Even a novice adventurer will love the variety of adventure options at the Muskegon Winter Sports Complex. A luge (one of only four in the country), ice skating through the woods, sledding and cross-country skiing are all part of the experience.

Downhill skiers and snowboarders will enjoy 15 groomed trails, four glade trails, the second-highest vertical drop in Michigan (or Wisconsin) and breathtaking views of Lake Superior at the Porcupine Mountains Ski Area. The ski area also offers a launching point for cross-country skiing and snowshoeing.





Shoe Year's Day Virtual Race to benefit state parks

Kick off 2018 with the Shoe Year's Day Virtual Race. Participants choose where and when to complete their outdoor activity, as long as it is done on two feet. You can run, walk, hike, snowshoe, cross-country ski or skate.

Participants will receive a commemorative finisher's medal and an event T-shirt and can register through Feb. 1. A portion of the proceeds benefits state parks.

Snowmobile season on track with plenty of snow

Explore the beauty of Michigan while riding along 6,000-plus miles of designated snowmobile trails.

Visit <u>michigan.gov/snowmobiling</u> to connect to online resources, such as trail maps, trail reports, closures and safety tips, as well as information on purchasing a trail permit. The snowmobile program is 100 percent funded with your trail permit dollars, and the dollars help fund trail grooming, signage, maintenance and more.





Unique winter wildlife viewing opportunities abound

When winter arrives, there are plenty of opportunities to view birds that migrate to Michigan for the frosty months. The great gray owl, northern shrike, pine grosbeak and common redpoll are just a few of the birds you can see. Closer to home, you may see dark-eyed juncos feeding on the ground under your bird feeder. Snowy owls are popping up all over the state this winter – look to open fields and lakeshores to spot these beautiful birds. <u>Explore wildlife viewing.</u>

Indoor learning adventures

The DNR also brings learning adventures indoors. Check out these DNR destinations that are perfect for an extra cold day, a family outing and much more.

Outdoor Adventure Center

Located on Detroit's riverfront, the Outdoor Adventure Center gives a taste of Michigan's great outdoors in the heart of the city. This 40,000-square-foot historic building plays host to hands-on activities, exhibits and simulators that help visitors experience the outdoors by touching a waterfall, stepping into a fishing boat, reeling in a big fish, riding a snowmobile and much more. The OAC is open five days a week and offers a variety of special events.

Michigan History Museum

The Michigan History Museum is located inside the Michigan Library and Historical Center in downtown Lansing. It is home to five levels of permanent and changing exhibits that tell the story of Michigan's past. It is open seven days a week.

Michigan History Center statewide events

Programs take place year-round at 11 historic sites and museums. A calendar listing of statewide events is available.

Safety Article

Did you get a chance to read the Ensign Magazine? It showed we still have our work cut out for us. The U.S. Coast Guard Recreational Boating Statistics for **2016** show a **12 percent increase in boating death** to 701 from 2015. The number of **accidents increased 7.3 percent** to 4,463. That breaks down to 5.9 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels. Once again the leading contributing factor in fatal boating accidents is **Alcohol**, at 15% of deaths. The top five contributing factors in accidents were operator <u>not paying attention</u>, <u>inexperienced</u> operator, <u>improper look out</u>, <u>excessive speed</u>, and <u>machine failure</u>. These are important facts for us to use to promote Boating Classes and safety. We have new tools at our disposal to accomplish this task.

In our Squadron, we have just purchased a Virtual Trainer computer set up to interest people in learning to Boat. If you know of some event that might benefit showcasing our Computer, let Chet know. Our Boating Classes will start Feb 26th at Grosse Pointe North High School with our ABC beginning boating class and Advanced Piloting. Anyone who takes a Boating Class with us is offered On the Water training with our Certified Instructors, on their boat or ours. If someone cant make it to a class, there are on line options. Multiple Seminars are available on line to include Partner in Command; Boating on Rivers, Locks, and Lakes; Weather for Boaters; Planning your Cruise: VHF Marine Radio; GPS; and AIS Electronics for Boaters. USPS has a Digital Media Library with videos that students can view from home or instructors can use to teach boating safety. Access the videos on line at uspsdml.org.

So get out there and share your love of Boating. Talk about Boating Safety and always wear your life jacket, don't drink alcohol and drive, wear your engine cut-off switch, get and encourage others to get Vessel Safety exam, and encourage boating safety classes.
