

Grand Traverse Sail & Power Squadron Lobster Bake



Keeping it moist

Many years ago Dr.Dan Daciuk had conversations with a colleague from New England about a lobster bake the colleague had been to back home. After hearing about this several times, Dan was intrigued enough to want to learn how to do it. Another colleague had a home on the water near Deep Water Point. That seemed to be the perfect place to build this fire and bake the lobsters. They had a flat steel plate they supported on concrete blocks so they could build the fire under it. They layered sea weed, then lobsters, potatoes, sausages, peppers, sweet corn, clams, another layer of seaweed, and topped it with wet newspapers. As it all cooked they sprayed it with water to keep it all moist and steaming.

This was so much fun and good eating that it grew to two or three bakes a year for family, friends, and the Coast Guard Auxiliary (which Dan was also an active member of). In fact, back in the day, the "Coast Guard Cowboys", as Dan called them, flew the lobsters in from Maine in their jet.

There was a break for 5 or 6 years with no lobster bakes. Dan decided to revive it. First, they had to find the steel plate. Its last known location was on the beach at the colleague's home. Several people walked the beach kicking the sand up with their toes until one of them stumbled upon it.

Occasionally Dan would do the lobster bake at different locations for family and friends. Then he decided to do one for our Power Squadron. For us he built the fire to cook the lobster on the Suttons Bay Beach for several years. The "Coast Guard Cowboys" were no longer a part of it, so they began ordering the lobsters, clams, and seaweed through a local food distributor. It became an annual event.

In 2003 we moved it to Elmwood Township Park just north of Traverse City. We held it there for 2 years then moved to Northport's Haserot Park where it has been held ever since. In 2007 Jerry Stephan was our District 9 Commander. Even though we had always had a few people from other districts attend, he wanted the event to be more inclusive with our district squadrons. We expanded the event to include a Friday evening bratwurst dinner and Saturday morning breakfast. We invited nearby squadrons to host those meals. Eventually the attendance for the breakfast waned so we discontinued it.

Changes have evolved in the Lobster Bake over the years. The seaweed became difficult to come by and expensive. We discovered that corn stalks would serve the same purpose. It was near impossible to keep the clams tender since we were cooking the lobster longer than the clams needed. So we discontinued them. People complained that it was too difficult to get the potatoes, peppers, and sausages out of the cornstalks, so we began putting them in "cook-in" bags until we had so many leftovers that we discontinued them.

We began offering prime rib and chicken breasts as alternatives to the lobster. The chicken option lasted a few years but interest became low so we discontinued it.

Haserot Park is an ideal location for this event and we plan to continue it there. We are happy to see that several people do make it a true rendezvous by bringing their boats to the adjacent marina.

2022 EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

- In calendar year 2022, the Coast Guard counted 4,040 accidents that involved 636 deaths, 2,222 injuries and approximately \$63 million dollars of damage to property as a result of recreational boating accidents.
 - The fatality rate was 5.4 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels.
 This rate represents a 1.8% decrease from the 2021 fatality rate of 5.5 deaths per 100,000 registered recreational vessels.
 - Compared to 2021, the number of accidents decreased 9.0%, the number of deaths decreased 3.3%, and the number of injuries decreased 15.9%.
- Where cause of death was known, 75% of fatal boating accident victims drowned. Of those drowning victims with reported life jacket usage, 85% were not wearing a life jacket.
- Where length was known, 3 of every 4 boaters who drowned were using vessels less than 21 feet in length.
- Alcohol use is the leading known contributing factor in fatal boating accidents; where the primary cause was known, it was listed as the leading factor in 16% of deaths.
- Where instruction was known, 74% of deaths occurred on boats where the operator did not receive boating safety instruction. Only 14% percent of deaths occurred on vessels where the operator had received a nationally-approved boating safety education certificate.
- There were 173 accidents in which at least one person was struck by a propeller.
 Collectively, these accidents resulted in 41 deaths and 182 injuries.
- Operator inattention, operator inexperience, improper lookout, excessive speed, and machinery failure ranked as the top five primary contributing factors in accidents.
- Where data was known, navigation rules violations were a contributing factor in 50% of accidents, 35% of deaths, and almost 60% of injuries.
- Collisions (with vessels, objects, groundings) were the most frequent first event in accidents, attributing to 55% of accidents, 21% of deaths, and 53% of injuries.
- Where data was known, the most common vessel types involved in reported accidents were open motorboats (47%), personal watercraft (18%), and cabin motorboats (14%).
- Where data was known, the vessel types with the highest percentage of deaths were open motorboats (47%), kayaks (14%), personal watercraft and pontoons (both 9%).
- The 11,770,383 recreational vessels registered by the states in 2022 represent a 1.6% decrease from last year when 11,957,886 recreational vessels were registered.

Prior to 1947 there were no district education officers. Initially the ranking educational officer, the chairman of education, served without rank and was appointed by the Governing Board. Later they became the DEO and was granted the rank of D/Lt/C in 1956. In 1962 an Asst. DEO was authorized. In 1974 the DEO and Asst. DEO were elected at the district conference, with prior approval of the director of education. Since 1967, every DEO who has served a full 3-year-term, except one, has been an officer of the National Educational Department.
